

DEPARTMENTAL PROMOTION AND TENURE PROCEDURES FAMILY AND CONSUMER SCIENCES

General Statement

The department faculty approved the following guidelines for promotion and tenure in June 1997. All faculty should adhere to the College of Agriculture and Home Economics Guidelines for Tenure and Promotion of Resident Instruction/Experiment Station Faculty. These guidelines are also consistent with general university procedures outlined in the New Mexico State University Administrative Policies and Procedures Manual, but are more specific to the unique mission and funding sources of the college.

Department Procedures

Criteria for evaluation of a faculty member in the Department of Family and Consumer Sciences will follow the College of Agriculture and Home Economics Guidelines for Tenure and Promotion of Resident Instruction/Experiment Station Faculty. All faculty are expected to balance teaching, research, and service endeavors consistent with their appointments. Feedback provided each year by the Departmental Promotion and Tenure Committee should be used by each faculty to alter and adjust performance in these arenas. All faculty members are expected to engage in scholarly activities that contribute to the role and mission of the department, college, and university. Refereed publications are necessary for promotion and tenure. However, other scholarly activities that transfer research-based knowledge or technology and attempt to solve problems for the department's diverse clientele are also valued. No additional promotion and tenure conditions or guidelines are specified for the department.
